SHPE National Conference

SHPE National Conference connects students, professionals, community leaders and corporations at one location as it is the largest Hispanic technical conference in the nation. The conference provides networking, educational, technical, and developmental opportunities for students. Some of the activities include: a career expo, technical and career workshops, the National Academic Olympiad, a graduate school fair, technical paper competitions, and the 24 Hours Extreme Engineering Challenge. As well as Pre-College Program which encourages elementary to High School Students to pursue opportunities in the STEM fields. This year the conference will be held in Fort Worth, Texas and approximately 10 students are expected to attend and participate in the above events.
